The training comprises a series of three interactive online one day sessions with discussion and small group work, enabling practice sharing with peers. Course dates are carefully paced, giving opportunity for trainer input and putting learning into practice.

What does the programme include?

- ❑ Welcome session to meet fellow participants, tailor objectives and develop working together agreements.
- ❑ Three full days of in depth SEND specialist RSE training.
- ❑ Activities to carry out in school between sessions to cascade your experience to colleagues.
- ❑ A final session where participants will bring and share their experiences of delivering RSE.
- ❑ Plus all session slides, guidance and ideas to try in school, bespoke question and answer opportunities, and signposting to useful resources.

Who should attend?

The programme is designed for teachers of RSE in SEND schools working with learners with moderate to severe learning disabilities and Autistic Spectrum conditions.

How much does it cost?

£575 per participant, providing over 20 hours of continuing professional development.
